Identifying and correcting the problem is easier when you know where to look. It's even easier if you can reach into your DBA toolbox and grab a query or two to pin down the problem. Come to the November meeting watch Jason Wong demonstrate how you can do this.

#### Presentation Preview

**Diagnosing Performance Issues using T-SQL presented by Jason Wong.**

From experiences, the best arsenal for SQL Server troubleshooting is simply a pair of powerful homegrown queries.

In this session, Jason Wong will simulate workloads, using PowerShell and T-SQL, on a demo SQL server engine and will diagnose and examine the execution process, namely wait type and active sessions via some powerful queries leveraging DMVs and DMFs.

**Jason Wong** has 25+ years of experience working as programmer, apps admin, IT Applications Manager, Sr. DBA in the greater Houston area. He has been a volunteer PASS speaker since 2008. 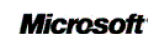
